



A Valuable Community Resource for 21 Years

In 2001 the Lake Area Free Clinic (LAFC) opened its doors for the first time and has been providing medical services to residents of Waukesha County who lack health insurance and the ability to pay for health care ever since. Over the past 21 years thousands of Waukesha County residents have received medical care, medication and practical information needed to improve and maintain their health. The Clinic also serves as a valuable resource arranging for follow-up medical services and offering health insurance enrollment assistance. LAFC is an independent 501(c)(3) organization *funded by donations and grants*.

A MEDICAL HOME FOR THOSE IN NEED

We are the medical home for our patients, providing labs, imaging, medication, transportation services, a referral network of specialists and insurance enrollment assistance, all at no cost

The need remains: It is estimated there are 16,000 Waukesha County adults who are medically uninsured

Medical services offered: Primary Care (acute and chronic) and the following specialties: Internal Medicine, Cardiology, Dermatology, Gastroenterology, Gynecology, Mental Health Counseling, Nephrology, Neurology, Orthopedics, Psychology, Rheumatology, Physical Therapy and Diabetes Clinic

Hours: Tuesday and Thursday evenings
(Call for appointment)

Referrals: Patients are referred from inpatient units, emergency departments, urgent care clinics, social, civic and religious organizations and word of mouth

COMMUNITY SUPPORTED

We serve residents of Waukesha County and the Oconomowoc School District who are uninsured with a household income at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Level

Staffing: Four full-time equivalent employees and more than 260 volunteers

Donated diagnostic services: ProHealth Care provides lab and x-ray services and Advocate Aurora Health provides CT and MRI imaging services

Clinical rotations for students: Affiliations with Waukesha County Technical College, and other colleges and universities for nursing, health information and medical interpreter students

Community partnerships: We utilize resources already in place to avoid duplication of services. Partners include Waukesha County Public Health for immunizations; Wisconsin Well Women Program and the Komen Foundation for health screening services; Waukesha County Mental Health for mental health services; and others.



Meeting a Major Need

The Lake Area Free Clinic's core purpose is to meet the widest range of health care needs of the economically challenged that it is able to support.

After identifying a glaring lack of access to preventive and basic dental services for low-income Waukesha County adults who were on BadgerCare or uninsured, LAFC opened its Dental Clinic in late 2017. Since that time, the Clinic has delivered compassionate, high quality dental care and support in a highly efficient environment with a dedicated staff of dental professionals.

A DENTAL HOME FOR THOSE IN NEED

Dental services offered:

Exams, cleanings, fillings, extractions, non-surgical periodontal therapy, crowns, some dentures, partial dentures and some root canals. Transportation and insurance enrollment assistance are also available. Uninsured patients are responsible for co-pays based on income. However, no one is turned away based on an inability to pay.

Monday - Thursday: 8:30 am to 5:00 pm
Friday: Hours vary

COMMUNITY SUPPORTED

Patient eligibility: We serve residents of Waukesha County and the Oconomowoc Area School District who have Medicaid or are uninsured with a household income at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level

Staffing: Primarily paid staff augmented with volunteers (volunteer opportunities exist for dentists, hygienists and dental assistants)

Waukesha County Technical College dental hygiene and dental assistant students and Marquette University dental students
